Our Open Days will continue on the second Sunday of the month but could change depending on volunteers so keep an eye on our Facebook page, Dublin Dispatch or website.



Council is proud to announce the recipients of the 2025 Australia Day Citizen of the Year awards:

Citizens of the Year: Anne and Robert Arbon

Anne and Robert Arbon have dedicated their time and passion to their community for over 40 years. They have contributed to many wellknown community organisations including the Melodrama Two Wells Group, Mallala Institute, Two Wells Uniting Church and Op Shop, Adelaide Plains Interchurch Council, Two Wells Probus and both the Mallala and Two Wells primary schools. In recognition of over 20 years continuous service, Anne and Robert are also life members of the Two Wells Melodrama Group.

Young Citizen of the Year: Kai-Leigh Wilson

Kai-Leigh shows deep commitment and passion to her community and the wellbeing of others. As the Vice President of the Plains Community Group she has been instrumental in establishing the group's Preserving and Connecting Generations project, which includes building an oral history of the Adelaide Plains council region. Kai-Leigh's dedication was recognised through the Governor's Civics Awards and she has been the Public Relations Officer for Cancer Research Advocate Bikers. Her inspiring and positive attitude and unwavering determination, whilst battling significant health issues of her own, makes her an exemplary role model for young people. Community

Event of the Year: Two Wells Christmas Parade, Street Market & Carnival 2023

The annual Two Wells Christmas Parade and Street Market allows the community to come together and celebrate the holiday season a cherished tradition for over 40 years. Coordinated by the Two Wells Regional Action Team and local volunteers, the 2023 event attracted around 4,500 people, 68 market stalls, 25 floats and subsidised carnival rides. Community Group of the Year: Plains Community Group Focused on improving the lives of residents across the region and meaningful community engagement, the Plains Community Group has had a big impact since its establishment in 2023. Through its many projects and events, including the Twinkling Trails and Twinkling Lights Competition each Christmas. and the Generations Preserving and Connecting project, the group has created inclusive and meaningful community projects that enhance social connection and preserve our heritage.

Community Project of the Year: Mallala Community Complex – Mallala & Districts Lions Club

The Mallala Community Complex is a purpose built emergency and relief centre designed to support emergency services during local disasters like bushfires or floods, while also providing a free meeting place for local community groups. Completed by the Mallala & Districts Lions Club with support from locals, the facility was officially opened in November 2023 and already holds an important place in the community.

I recently spoke to the Dublin History Group and while it was a small gathering, I made the point groups such as theirs are the last bastion against the continual erosion of the importance our European history.

While it is important our children learn Australia was inhabited before British settlement and they learn of aboriginal cultures and customs, I am concerned the process of the settlement of Australia, first by Britain, then by the nations of the world is being ignored.

While most of us are committed to the conservation of the natural environment, we should also be cognisant very little of what we recognise as modern Australia would exist if we had conserved everything. No farm-lands, no vineyards, no irrigation, cities, industry, mines, steel, modern medical systems, no national government etc, etc, and we should never underestimate the effort and resolve of our pioneers who enabled this to happen.

It's difficult to fully appreciate the drive of a man like John McDouall Stuart who was the first European to traverse the continent through the middle and return. More than 2,500km of completely unknown country through unrelenting deserts. That pathway gave us the first Overland telegraph.

Edward John Eyre, the first to cross the Nullarbor, Hamilton Hume, Sturt are but a few of a plethora of intrepid explorers who opened-up Australia for agriculture and industry. It is important we always remember the ingenuity and importance of the stump jump plough, the value of the wool and copper industries in establishing Australia, the birth of democracy in Greece and its development into the Westminster system in Britain, to which we owe our democracy. The list is endless and yet is one a child of today is likely to learn little of through our education system.

Increasing numbers are starting to understand our education system has been sidetracked by woke, activist agendas and realisation and realignment is urgently needed, but in the meantime, we need accurate recordings of actual events so the wisdom gained from our history can be reintegrated with our future. That is where groups like the DHG have a role to play.



The big news in the Parham And District Action Group (PADAG) since our last report is that we are now an Incorporated Body, with our constitution being formally approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission on 6th December 2024. Until now PADAG has operated as a committee of the Port Parham Sports and Social Club Incorporated (PPSSC), and this now means that PADAG operates independently of PPSSC and is able to apply for grants etc under its own name.

The obtaining of grants will be a prime requirement for developing the foreshore precinct once the concept plan is approved. Plan approval is waiting on action from the Adelaide Plains Council (APC), whilst PADAG is progressing the costing of various elements of the plan. PADAG has provided input to the "Parham and Webb Beach Settlement Plan" prepared by the Adelaide Plains Council. This covers amongst other things the precinct development and provides for a recreational area to be developed between the Club and the CFS water tank and Jinker Centre. Unfortunately, the restoration of the former oval to the south of the club now appears to be a lost cause. The plan was approved by Council at its December 2024 meeting.

PADAG has incorporated in its name "District" and its brief extends to other areas in the district. In this role PADAG has made a submission to Council to clean up the area of Old Port Wakefield Road to the south of South Terrace in Dublin with a view to ultimately using this as a RV parking area. This submission was placed in conjunction with a submission from the Coalition of Coastal Communities to place the dump protest statues in this area. Both submissions were considered by the Council at its December 2024 meeting with motions passed requiring Council to carry out further investigation of the proposals. PADAG has completed the provision of a public notice board on the interpretative centre at Webb Beach. To provide greater visibility of the organisation of PADAG to the community, signs have been prepared listing our achievements, and these will be placed in appropriate locations around the community.

Recently the Adelaide Plains Council has been holding confidential sessions on the Lease of the Port Parham Campground. This is creating considerable concern among PADAG members as a lot of volunteer work has been carried out by community members as a result of an approach from Council for the community to take over the operation of the campground. Our belief tis that the community should be rewarded for its input and funds raised from the campground should be use for community development. We are monitoring this activity as closely as we can within the limits of the confidentiality.

PADAG and the Dublin History Group continue to develop proposals for celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Dublin, Port Parham and Windsor in 2026. Lock in the Adelaide Cup Weekend, 6-8 March 2026 to be part of these celebrations.

PADAG continues to focus and lobby on a number of issues including the collection of green waste, illegal dumping, neighbourhood watch, the parking of unregistered and unused vehicles on street verges, potential flooding, particularly in Prime Street, the sight lines in the Webb Beach Road intersection

PADAG always welcomes input from community members. All are welcome at our monthly meetings 2nd Tuesday of month 7pm at the club. Come and bring your ideas or offer your services.

Residing for the period of twenty years at Dublin, S.A., where they owned the hotel, Mrs. Ormsby showed great interest in all branches of charitable works, and the esteem in which she was held by the people of Dublin and surrounding districts was shown in the farewell presentations made to her and the family on their departure for Wallaroo, where she resided until her death last month. Her husband and three children—Jack, Mary (Mrs. Hicks), and Alfred—are left to mourn their sad loss.

Rev. Fr. Phillips, C.P., conducted the burial service at the Kadina Cemetery. May she rest in peace.

The order finalises a petition filed in the Court by the Electoral Commissioner of South Australia (ECSA) disputing the outcome of the recount that followed the resignation of a councillor in October 2023. The dispute arose from an error in the settings applied by ECSA to the computer counting software used for the counting of votes in complex elections. I would like to acknowledge Carmine Di Troia for his 6 years of service to his community, representing the Lewiston ward and, in recent times, as an area councillor. Carmine has always shown interest in all Council-related matters and I wish him well for his future endeavours. A recount of the votes cast at the November 2022 periodic election will be conducted by ECSA to fill the vacancy. This process is expected to take place in early January 2025.

Terry-Anne Keen duly elected as Area Councillor Terry-Anne Keen has been successfully declared as the newest councillor of Adelaide Plains Council. The Electoral Commission of South Australia (ECSA) undertook a recount of votes that were cast at the November 2022 periodic election. following the Court of Disputed Returns declaration that disputed the outcome of a separate, previous recount undertaken to fill a vacancy in November 2023. Four candidates, who were unsuccessful in the November 2022 election, advised they were willing to fulfill the

vacancy. Terry-Anne Keen achieved the highest number of votes in the recount and was provisionally declared elected on Monday 6 January 2025, with the Returning Officer at ECSA making the formal declaration on Thursday 9 January 2025. The outcome of the ECSA recount now finalises the petitions filed in the Court of Disputed Returns.


