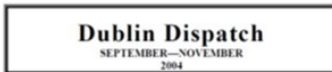

Maybe that's why we have Father's Day—so we can just give him our love and hope he knows all these special things that words can't say.

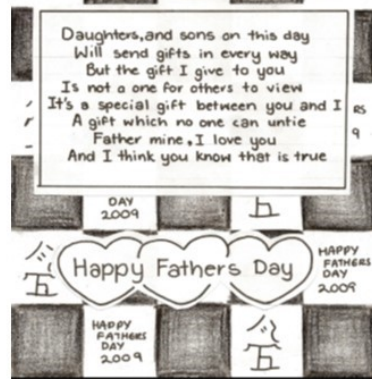
