The Plan provides a vision and comprehensive strategy for the sustainable development of Greater Adelaide over the next 30 years.

The Plan will identify where an extra 315,000 homes can be located and where jobs will be created as the state's population expands. It will provide greater certainty to community, councils and the development sector on the long-term growth of Greater Adelaide in response to the increasing demand for housing.

The community is invited to share its views on key priorities of the Plan including:

- ◆ the location of new housing and employment
- ◆ major infrastructure required to support growth
- ◆ specific areas that should be protected from future development.

Proposal for dogs to be on leash in the Lewiston Wetlands & Reserves Trails

The Lewiston Wetlands & Reserves Trails are 7 kilometres of remnant vegetation reserves linked by shared trails. They are a popular place for people to walk, run, cycle, ride their horse or walk their dog.

Concerns have been raised about the mixed rules for dogs on or off leash in the trails leading to confusion for people walking dogs, and possible conflict between dogs off leash and horses.

We are proposing to designate the Lewiston Wetlands & Reserves Trails as a dog on-leash area. This would provide clarity for people

walking dogs about what is expected. It will also provide confidence for horse riders that dogs will be on leash. It also addresses the uncertainty around which parts of the trails are designated as a wetland (with dogs required to be on-leash) or reserves (where dogs can currently be off-leash under effective control).

Consultation is open from 16 October 2024 to 9am Thursday 7 November 2024.

Royal Commission into Domestic, Family and Sexual Violence

The Royal Commission, established on 1/7/24, has been asked to inquire into four key areas: prevention, early intervention, response and recovery and healing.

The Commissioner, Natasha Stott Despoja's focus is to develop recommendations that lead to a domestic, family and sexual violence system which can better meet the needs of those who interact with it and is capable of delivering the generational change required to bring an end to the scourge.

The Commissioner is inviting people with lived experience to contribute by participating in an online survey.

The survey can be found at royalcommissiondfsv.sa.gov.au and closes on 10/12/24.

The survey invites residents to answer a series of questions and also leave an audio or written message if they choose.

The Avon Art & Craft Guild (AACG) has been busy the last couple months and thank those volunteers involved in the various projects and helped out in any of the various ways. The delivery of the various items contributed by volunteers for the Adelaide Women's Prison project required quite some time and effort collecting and delivery.

The Emergency Readiplan program was well attended early September with many pointers on being prepared not only physically but also mentally for an Emergency. Following this event the AACG has sewn up some bright orange emergency grab bags which will be on sale at the Craft Hall. The group also made a number of shopping style bags with donated material. The bags then donated to Boxes of Love program. One of the more current programs was weaving rag mats, backed by non-slip rubber backing for safety. The forthcoming program involves needle felting to be followed by making paper flowers leading up to the Christmas break.

The Avon District Hall (ADH) committee is extremely grateful to the Mudge brothers for the demolishing the old and replacing the

boundary fence along the pine trees. It looks great with no more barb wire to get entangled with, when parking vehicles in this area.

At long last due to a grant from Balaklava Swap Shop we have access to outside water for the garden. Whilst this has been a dream for some time, we can now start Beautifying Avon with much more confidence, being able to water plants with a hose rather carrying buckets of water which was a real chore for our elderly volunteers and to the detriment of some plants, Thanks to all involved in the support of this project. Members of the craft club also see this as a great opportunity to do wet felting outside when they recommence on the 21st January 2025.

Avon would like to welcome new comers to Avon, and hope they can find it a happy and joyful transition in their new environment.

Community Car

The Mid North Community Passenger Network provides transport options for residents who are unable to access transport to medical, health and some personal appointments.

A community car based at Mallala is available for residents to attend medical or health appointments locally or in metropolitan areas. Accredited volunteer drivers collect passengers from their home and transport them to and from their appointment. Carers may travel free but must remain with the client at all times.

Eligible residents may be taken to medical, health and hospital appointments and some shopping and social activities (conditions apply).

This fee for service option provides flexibility and is available for appointment between 10am and 2pm Monday – Friday. Fees are based on distance travelled and include the return trip.

Veteran Affairs Gold cardholders may be entitled to service fee reimbursement. Outpatients of the Flinders Medical Centre, Royal Adelaide, Queen Elizabeth or Modbury Hospitals may also be eligible for reimbursement for all or part of travel costs.

COALITION OF COASTAL COMMUNITIES

As reported in the last edition of the Dublin Dispatch, the Coalition of Coastal Communities decided to go into abeyance pending the response from the Adelaide Plains Council on various issues.

Since then APC has responded and the Chairperson, John Drexel, and Secretary, Alvin Jenkin have met with the CEO and the Infrastructure Manager of APC. The following were outcomes from this meeting:

John Drexel will do a deputation to the elected body on the Salt Creek Remediation proposals at the October 2024 general meeting of APC

Alvin Jenkin will prepare a document indicating preferred locations for the Protest Statues in the Dublin vicinity

A proposal will be prepared and submitted to APC for the cleaning up of Old Port Wakefield Road south of South Terrace and allocating this space for limited tenure self contained RV parking.

The issue of naming the coast as “The Shorebird Coast” will be raised again with Council.

Parham & District Action Group

The prime focus at present of the Parham and District Action Group is the development of the Parham foreshore precinct between the car park and the boat ramp. Negotiations are continuing with the Adelaide Plains Council to progress this important project.

Recently it was agreed that the scope of the development be extended to include the boat ramp and the toilets. This allows for the potential replacement of the toilet block, the provision of fish and boat cleaning facilities, and additional parking in the area.

It was anticipated that Adelaide Plains Council would assist with costing the proposed development in order that applications could be made for grant monies to commence actual works. APC have now advised that due to budget restrictions they are not able to provide resources to provide this assistance. It thus falls back on the PADAG working group to put together draft costings. Our keen volunteers are working on this but it introduces delays in getting started. At this stage it is hoped that we will be in a position to make applications for grants in late 2025.

As an input to their planning consultancy process, Adelaide Plains Council sought comment on naming of "Port Parham" versus "Parham". There was strong support for using the term "Port Parham" and Council therefore wrote to the South Australian Place Names authority seeking a name change. A response

has been received advising that "Parham" was gazetted in 1876, and it will remain that way. PADAG have chosen not to pursue this matter further.

A PADAG subcommittee looks after the day to day maintenance of the Parham Camp Ground. In response to this PADAG receives income from the Camp Ground which must be used for works within the community. We receive many favourable comments about the facility and the activity of volunteers. This season there appears to be a considerable down turn in activity, and it appears that this is consistent with many areas across the state, probably due to the cost of living challenges that people are facing.

PADAG and the Dublin History Group continue to develop proposals for celebrating the **150th Anniversary of Dublin, Port Parham and Windsor** in 2026. Lock in the Adelaide Cup Weekend, 6-8 March 2026 to be part of these celebrations.

PADAG continues to focus and lobby on a number of issues including the collection of green waste, illegal dumping, neighbourhood watch, the parking of unregistered and unused vehicles on street verges, potential flooding, particularly in Prime Street, the sight lines in the Webb Beach Road intersection

PADAG always welcomes input from community members. All are welcome at our monthly meetings 2nd Tuesday of month 7pm at the club. Come and bring your ideas or offer your services.

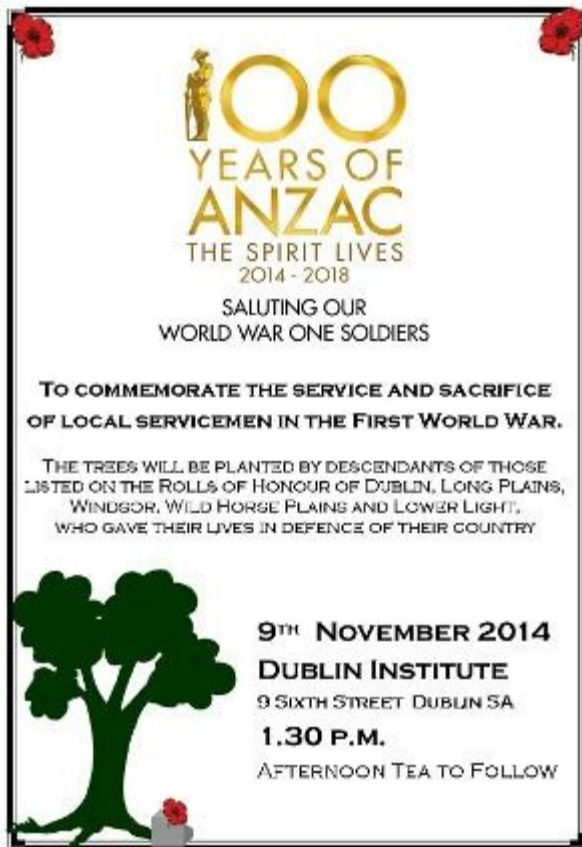

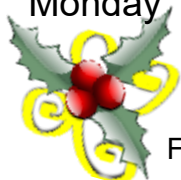
